

NEXT STEPS It can be extremely difficult to navigate the next steps for your teenager as they reach school leaving age. At a time of great disruption and uncertainty surrounding the pandemic it will appear even harder. Those of you nurturing recently departed year 11's waiting for their results or those who have a child in year 10 who are still unsure what to do or where to start, I hope this blog will help you.

In order to make the whole process of next steps easier and simpler to digest I have broken it down into three key questions, with the advice we would give students:

Which is better? Studying A levels, BTEC or equivalent qualifications, or Apprenticeships?

There is no real right or wrong answer to this question. It is simply a matter of what is right for you as an individual. Remember that A levels are assessed with terminal exam papers and often have higher entry requirements from your GCSE grades. BTEC or equivalent have an equal weighing to A levels if you study single (1 A level equivalent), double (two A level equivalent) or triple (3 A level equivalent) award. By equivalent I mean they hold the same UCAS points for University. BTEC's are often more career topic specific such as Engineering or Health and Social care and A levels tend be subject centred such as Maths or Biology. Apprenticeships are an alternative to academic study and will be linked directly to the employer you are working for. They will pay for your studies alongside working and will also pay you a working wage. Do your research and find what is best for you.

2 When do I have to decide?

There are specific deadlines for college or sixth form places and these are generally around October to February time. Although places are limited and so we recommend you apply as early as you can to avoid disappointment. We will be publishing all post 16 application opening dates as well as open days and events at each institution. Apprenticeships always offer places across the year and it is important to keep all your options open. You are not limited to one place or one route, apply for both if you want to. You only make your final decision once you get your results so apply and accept offers for plan A-D if you can. It is always good to have a back-up!

3 What should I be doing now?

THREE STEPS

ONE

Now is a time for young people to start reflecting on what their interests, skill sets and passions are. What really interests them? What kind of jobs will enable them to make full use of those? We want them to find a career that they will really enjoy and find fulfilling. Everyone has different strengths and there is not a one size fits all route.

TWO

Do as much research as possible, look at online videos, explore websites of different companies, sixth forms, colleges, and universities. Look at what they have to offer and what the entrance requirements are. Ask Mrs Mylrea for a careers appointment (you will see her and the team anyway in year 11 but there's no harm in taking initiative). Use your PSHE lesson to full effect in September, here you will have time and support to research.


THREE

Always keep a record of what you research, use it to make a shortlist or form questions to ask employers or colleges when you apply to them. We will help you with this in September too.

We sat down with Aidan to ask him all about it.



Where are you starting your apprenticeship? I am starting my apprenticeship at Taylor Made Joinery sometime in July/August this year.

What was the interview like?

I was nervous at first but it was fine when I was there. They were really friendly and gave me a tour of the building.

What is your fondest memory of Stowmarket High School? My after school and lunch times in the design room making my projects.

What was the best bit of advice you every received from one of your teachers? Never give up - Mr Burgess.

Cheryl Hardacre from Taylor Made Joinery said "We are delighted to offer Aidan Taylor a Bench Joinery Apprenticeship. As part of the interview process, Aidan was asked to upload a short video and CV. Aidan was then invited to TMJ Interiors for a tour of our facilities with our workshop manager, where he completed a task and was interviewed.

There was strong competition in this round of cohorts, but Aidan stood out; he will begin his journey as an apprentice this summer, learning and developing his skills under the watchful eye of our experienced joiners while on the bench in our Apprentice and Technology Centre.

Aidan will be assigned tasks, but he will also have the opportunity to work on some of our prestigious "live" projects. In addition, he will be attending college for 24 months to complete his Level 2 Carpentry & Joinery, Pathway 2 Architectural Joinery Apprenticeship. This includes completing practical tasks along the way, demonstrating skills, compiling evidence and written documents, and working toward the end point assessment, which includes a theory test, a 7-hour practical exam, and a professional conversation about the task.

Aidan will be a valuable addition to our team".




