Year 11 Spring Progress Check 2022 (2)

We are writing to let you know that from **10am on Tuesday 29th March**, your child's Progress Check will be ready for you to view on Go4Schools. This Progress Check indicates how your child is doing and can be used to give you some indication as to how much work is required between now and their GCSE exams.

These reports contain the results of both sets of PREs, so hopefully you will see progress from the first set to the second set of data. If this is not the case, then I would certainly recommend speaking your child and making an appointment to speak to the teacher on the Tripod Evening to discuss why improvements have not been seen and what actions can be taken.

The next **Yr11 Tripod Evening** for all subjects, is on the **31st of March** when teachers will be able to discuss the PRE outcomes with you. This will be the last Tripod Evening before the examination season begins in May and I strongly urge you to make appointments to speak to your child's teachers.

Effort

This will give you an idea of how hard your child is working. I cannot over-emphasise just how important it is that students continue to put in as much effort as they can with their studies. We are on the final leg of the GCSE journey, and it really does need to be maximum effort from now!

Effort	Description
1	Very little effort shown in lessons. Regularly off-task. Behaviour may disrupt own and others learning. Shows very little motivation. Very poor attitude to learning
2	Some effort is shown in lessons, but this is inconsistent and there is behaviour that sometimes disrupts own or others learning. A better attitude to learning is required.
3	Appropriate effort is being shown in lessons. Behaviour is positive and motivation and attitude to learning is at an acceptable level.
4	Good effort, behaviour, motivation and attitude are shown in lessons.
5	Excellent effort in every lesson. Strives to carry out tasks to the very best of their ability. Excellent behaviour, motivation and attitude to learning.

Professional Predicted Grade (PPG)

The report also contains your child's target grade and predicted grade for each subject at the end of Year 11. This Professional Predicted Grade is based upon a variety of evidence from throughout the course, with the more recent evidence being counting the most in the determination of the PPG.

Pre-Public Exam



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This is the grade that was achieved in the previous two sets of Pre-public Exams. Students sat full past papers and so these results give us a very accurate indication as to how students might perform in the real exam.
