Covid

The decision to stop supplying free Covid test kits is not one I support. The impact of the continuing pandemic can be seen in schools across the country, across Suffolk and across Stowmarket. Some schools in Suffolk are having to send whole year groups home, such is the impact of staff absence. We are not far off this ourselves, but so far have managed to survive by the skin of our teeth. On some days I have only two senior leaders in school, and we have up to eight supply staff in, with other staff covering more than they are contractually required to do.

My concern is that with all other costs going up, hard pressed families will prioritise the heating and food rather than a test kit — and I understand why. The problem is then the virus becomes unchecked and can continue to multiply and mutate. We do have some stock of kits, and we will be issuing them as prudently as we can, until our stocks have been emptied.

Business Studies

On a more upbeat tone, the Year 9 Business students raised a total of £632 pounds through their efforts last week. With three groups still to declare their takings 9C have a total of £187.50 and have donated to the two chosen charities of the WWF and Lend with Care. 9A, led by an extraordinary young entrepreneur, Harrison Hunn, have made an amazing £444.47 with Harrison's group contributing £170 of that and donating all of their £150 profit to UNICEF. Each group has also contributed their £5 to the Business charity which means we have £65 to sponsor an animal of the students' choice with the WWF and invest into a micro-finance business whereby the money will be repeatedly returned to us to reinvest.

Bobby Clancy's group discovered one of their 50ps is in fact worth £3.49 and so they are now looking into plans to sell that!
