

For example, civil engineering can include structural and construction engineering, city planning, transportation, and sanitation.


Mechanical engineering, covers everything from the steam engine to aircraft and the future of robotics and bio-mechanics.


Chemical engineering covers aspects like biotechnology and pharmaceuticals and many further exciting avenues.







Photography & Videography






