# **Pride Month**

This month is Pride Month and the Suffolk Pride March was in Ipswich last weekend. It got me thinking about how our next steps are so linked to who we are and how we see ourselves that it seemed pertinent to address this with our LGBTQ+ community in school in this edition of the newsletter.

Students who identify as part of this ever more wonderfully colourful and diverse group of people struggle to connect with who they are or feel like they can't access their true self due to discrimination or fear of such.

Throw into the mix the frightening concept of leaving school and making choices around what career direction they may take can feel so overwhelming.

In order to support these students, I have written up 4 key career tips for LGBTQ+ students, as highlighted by Forbes 2018.

Research indicates that 46% of LGBTQ+ employees have not revealed this identity to coworkers.

In order to create an environment where employees are more committed to and satisfied with their job, it is imperative that the workplace allows employees to be their authentic selves. Find a job that welcomes your full self: When searching for a job, it is important to conduct thorough research on the companies, to have a deeper understanding of the organisational values. Have conversations with past and current employees. Would you really want to work for a company that does not accept you for who you truly are?

Find community at work: There is a lot of value in creating a network of friends and allies in the workplace. If your organisation does not have an LGBTQ+ employee resource group, you can be the one to spearhead it

Communicate with and educate your co-workers: In the process of developing an LGBTQ+ -inclusive workplace, evaluate the diversity and inclusion training that takes place. Is the training up-todate when it comes to relevant LGBTQ+issues? Create a dialogue with your employer regarding modifications and improvements to the current training that can be done.

Lean on your external community: It is a valuable practice for you to also connect with the LGBTQ+ community outside of your workplace. Connect with other LGBTQ+ individuals as well as allies via Facebook, LinkedIn, Meetup, and your other personal and social networks. Having a network full of supportive individuals and other LGBTQ+ professionals can aid in the jobsearch process, and particularly in the search to find an inclusive organisation, and you can utilise these connections for career advice and guidance.

# careers in the curriculum CICIO ICS

Last Wednesday our Year 10 and Year 11 Graphic Design Students were treated to a visit from Ogi Damyan, Director of O-Worlds and a specialist in the graphics, art, animation and VR fields. Ogi, visited both groups and showed them a project he has recently been working on as a specialist in graphics, art, animation and virtual/augmented reality. After watching his impressive work, he continued to support our students by highlighting how the world of virtual and augmented reality is starting to become increasingly popular and the demands for designers is going to surge as more and more applications for this technology grow. He also introduced our students to the term Metaverse, a virtual world of limitless possibilities where people can connect, work, play and much more, facilitated by the use of virtual and augmented reality headsets.

Ogi was open to answering any of the questions our students had, who were keen to know more about his general working



arrangement, how he got into the career in the first place, and how designing in a virtual reality world actually works. They were also intrigued to discover how they might start experiencing more virtual and augmented reality in the future too. Overall, our students benefitted hugely from Ogi's visit which was really inspiring and helped gain an insight into graphic design opportunities in the future. He hit a real chord with a handful of students too who expressed an interest in developing some of their own work and ideas with a variety of free software packages he recommended we experiment with.

The benefits of this software may also have the potential to be experienced by some of our other students in the future too. Look out for CAD Club

in the new school year where students can come to develop their skills and knowledge across a variety of software packages helping them to complete work from lessons or start designing and developing their own virtual worlds, computer games, and visual effects.

We plan on keeping in touch with Ogi so our students can continue to experience how the world of graphic design is evolving and help them to discover their place in it.

# careers in the curriculum engineering

Earlier this week our Year 10 Engineering students were visited by Josh Finbow, Sub Agent & Regional Engineer from Jackson Civil Engineering, a local engineering firm that specialise in developing highways and flood defence solutions over much of the United Kingdom including the development of the new Gateway 14 facility being built in Stowmarket. What was also fantastic is that Josh is a past student of Stowmarket High School and was keen to talk to students about his experiences within the industry and why he would encourage others to do the same.

Josh was keen to find out what routes our students were considering following the completion of their GCSE's. Initially, a small number expressed an interest in studying at university, with others more focused on going to college or studying A-Levels at this stage. Following some further discussion outlining Josh's own experience, many of our students were keen to hear about the work experience and apprenticeship opportunities available at Jackson that could help them learn and earn and potentially also obtain a degree.

After a short video showing the students the type of projects Jackson have worked on,

Josh took the class outside and introduced them to some of the equipment he uses on a regular basis. This provided our students with some insight into the types of work he would commonly be doing, its purpose and significance in helping to achieve getting large scale engineering projects started and off the ground.

Despite a couple of technical issues meaning the students could not collect data with the GPS device, they were able to use the dumpy level, a device used to determine landmass formations and elevations. Josh was able to explain how this type of work would have been essential for the construction firm that built the school to carry out to ensure the land was level and the corners of the build were in the right place prior to construction starting. Overall it was a fantastic opportunity for our engineers to see where their skills from the subject could take them in the future and discover the range of career routes that are available. Josh will be visiting

the school again soon with another one of our engineering groups and hopes to have more success with the equipment allowing our students a more authentic experience. So, watch this space to see what they get up to.
