Welcome to my new readers, and welcome back to the families well used to my newsletters. Only one place to start;

The Queen

In such momentous times, there is a balance to be struck within school between sharing thoughts and feelings, answering questions and reflecting the national mood, against continuing with the normal diet of lessons.

I hope that we found that balance last week. As students arrived on Friday we played Benjamin Britten, Elgar and Ralph Vaughan Williams on the atrium sound system, whilst showing a single slide acknowledging the Queen's passing. We were able to send out respectful and informative information for all tutor groups for registration, and we held a minute silence, superbly respected at 12 noon.

Staff were told to push on with lessons, but to use their own judgement if students wanted to ask questions about the Queen, and what her passing means to the country, including those who do not believe in the concept of monarchy.

Over the next week we will keep school life as normal as possible, but we will use the atrium screen to publicise the official events and Personal Development sessions will focus on the life and achievements of the Queen. I will of course be closing the school on Monday 19th following the announcement of the official bank holiday.

Expectations

As we start the year, a couple of reminders about our expectations here at Stowmarket High. Students should be punctual – building good habits that will support them throughout their life. They should be smart, wearing the full uniform, and be prepared by having the correct equipment and resources for learning.

The Summer

As well as various internal building works, IT improvements and repairs, the summer of course saw the Year 11 students collect their examination results. Over recent years, primarily due to Covid many Suffolk schools have pulled back from publicly releasing official figures. I was always in favour of this, because the league table obsession creates an unfair competition between schools, providing frankly unhelpful single statistics that hide the very complicated factors of every different cohort. The real losers in this process were the schools at the bottom of the table and having been there with the various schools I have worked in that are often described as being some of the more 'challenging', I have continued the policy of not pushing forward simple statistics. This is a position adopted across the Waveney Trust. In fact, all three High schools were very pleased with their results this year, which was great news for all the young people concerned.

What we did do, was attract significant media interest, which was great, because we were able to share individual stories of success. Results day is always bittersweet however, as amongst the delight there was the disappointment for those who didn't achieve the grade or grades they wanted. Within school we analyse the results in great detail and constantly evaluate our own performance and practices to minimise those disappointments as much as possible, and we of course start the year by emphasising to Year 11 in particular how the GCSE examination rewards consistent hard work. Mr West and Mr Rourke-Beasley, supported by Mrs Fisher are the team that will work with Year 11 this year to help them achieve their goals, and they will be leaning hard on 'the tripod' because when all three legs work effectively together, we have a significant upturn in success rates. This process kicks off on Thursday with our SEND focussed 'Next Steps' event, which will be repeated the following week for the families of the rest of Year 11.

The term has started very well, with staff having safeguarding and fire safety training on top of the usual updates and refreshers about teaching and learning. Students have all had their photographs retaken, and Year 7 have been smoothly inducted as well as undertaking their Cognitive Ability Tests. Long may this smooth start continue!

Here is to a new term, new staff and students, and a new monarch.


