Where are they now?

Our popular Alumni Feature Where are They Now returns this year, in our first issue we sit down with former student James Kimpton, currently working as a Software Engineer with BT. What have you done since leaving Stow High and where are you working now?

Since leaving Stow High, I am currently doing a Software Engineering degree apprenticeship with BT. As a software engineer, I write code, develop websites, work across numerous time zones with international colleagues and help support systems that are a fundamental part of the UK's infrastructure. In fact, 99% of the UK's internet traffic goes through my site of work and is a global technology hub for BT.

What is your fondest memory of Stowmarket High School?

My fondest memory of Stowmarket High School is the results days, both GCSE + A-Level. After all these years - I still remember the buzz, I got getting the results that helped define my future – It is a day where it truly reflects the effort and work you have put in for the last couple of years.

What was the best bit of advice you ever received from one of your teachers?

The best advice I got in school is to ask for help when you need it and don't bottle it up – you're not going to know everything straight away and in the working world, the only way to improve and grow as a professional is

to seek support from people who are more experienced and know what they're talking about.

What advice would you give your Year 7 self now?

To my year 7 self, I would say begin pursuing your passion as soon as possible and find out what you enjoy doing. I have found personally that it will ground you in terms of wellbeing and happiness and more recently than ever, this has been a massive motivational factor for me putting 100% effort into everything I do in the hope that I get better at what I do and thrive.

What were your favourite subjects at school and how have they helped you in your job today would you say?

My favourite subjects at school were unsurprisingly IT and Maths as a lifelong techie. They have helped me develop good problem-solving skills with a good foundation in tackling complex concepts and breaking them down into easier chunks. The soft skills and technical skills I picked up in IT and Maths have carried over even to my current day-to-day job 6 years later.

Shout out to anyone in particular?

For me, they were both influential for my personal development and I hope they continue inspiring the next generation and wish them (and the other teachers I had) all the best!

What they used to do

Our regular feature on Staff at Stowmarket High School and their previous career journeys. This month we sit down with our very own mMr Blewitt, Teacher of Philosophy and Ethics.



What did you use to do before you worked at Stowmarket High School?

I was a Head of Year for 2 years in a school in Northamptonshire and before that I was a teacher of RE in a school in St Neots, Cambridgeshire.

When I graduated from Lancaster University in 1995, I spent five years working on a Mushroom farm. Initially as a quality control manager and later as assistant production manager. Among the student population I have taught since arriving in 2006, this whole episode has moved into legend!

What did 10-year-old you want to be when they grew up can you remember?

I have had a life-long love of cars which came from my grandfather who was an incredible motor engineer. Legend has it that whilst working for a Ford main agent in Grantham, he was once visited by a Texan gentlemen from Ford headquarters who invited him to join their F1 team in the 1960s - needless to say that this didn't happen, as my Grandmother didn't like the idea of him being away from home for such long periods. Because of his skills and knowledge, I desperately wanted to work with cars.

What was the best bit of advice you ever received from one of your employers?

Try to do something you love as you'll never work a day in your life. The large part, being part of the Stowmarket High School family for the last 16+ years, this has proven to be sound advice!

What advice would you give your Year 7 self now?

Work hard. Dig deep and never, ever give up on understanding maths! Because I didn't have the resilience to dig deep and ask for help when I didn't understand I didn't become a teacher until I was nearly 27! Never, ever let this happen to you. There is always a way, you just need to find it.

What were your favourite subjects at school and how have they helped you in your job today would you say?

English, RE and History. I did all of them at A-level and they have provided me with a life-long love of all three subjects

What is your career highlight to date?

I had the honour and privilege of being Head of Sixth Form for 4 years and this was a wonderful period. I loved working with students and helping them through the process of applying to university. It was a magical time.

Any career low points or comedy moments that stand out?

As many of my current and past students will tell you, I have had so many comedic incidents throughout my career - if I was honest, I would struggle to pick just one. But if I were pushed, I remember about 10 years ago I had a wonderful Year 11 group that when it came to their last lesson with me, they organised afternoon tea. We sat in my old classroom in B1 eating crumpets and drinking tea. The reason they did this, was because a famous story of mine I share with students that during my first year of teaching I became addicted to crumpets - a fact I am sure you'll find hard to believe due to my incredibly sporty physique!

Take Your Child to Work Day Success

Congratulations to Year 10 student Daniel Calver who had a highly successful first experience of the world of work.

Daniel took part in the Year 9 take your child to work day at the very end of last term, he spent his day in the Design Department of Suffolk New College.

Daniel spent the day designing a front cover for the new college prospectus amongst other tasks. The Marketing Manager was so impressed with his design, that they choose it for the cover of their 2023/2024 prospectus which is now lining the shelves in the Inspirational Futures Centre, with a named credit for both Daniel and the school in the back of the prospectus.

Here Daniel shares the experience of his day:

"When I got to the college I was shown around. I also got to see the animals, gardens, and farms that the students took care of. I was introduced to the people my mum works with and got to try the finishing equipment. I tried a comb binder, folding machine and A2 guillotine. I tried using the different printers and illustrator and other software to make designs like the prospectus."
