Hi All

The academic year is already three weeks old, and all students have settled into school life extremely well. We are very proud of our Year 7 students who now seem like they have been part of the Stowmarket High furniture for many a year and we thank Miss Harrigan for her leadership of the year group. Additionally, we have seen our first trip overseas leave and return, successfully – Mrs Relf took several students to Ypres and all returning comments were of excellent conduct by our students and an invaluable experience had by all. In respect of extra-curricular activities, we pride ourselves on the opportunities we offer our students outside of the classroom, including the clubs programme we offer all students on a daily/weekly basis - please see our website for further information.

A key strategic focus of the school is to ensure all learners of the ability to recall and retrieve the knowledge that has been taught to them. You may have heard from your child, the use of 'Do Now' starters at the beginning of all lessons. The purpose of these tasks is to give the students a short period at the beginning of each lesson to recall and retrieve the learning gained from the previous lessons, securely embedding key knowledge that they will use throughout their curriculum. We are thrilled with the impact of these directed tasks, allowing all lessons to have a calmer, swifter, and direct start to each lesson; we congratulate and celebrate all students for the way they have taken to such learning.

As previously mentioned, please be aware the school will have an early close of 2:00pm on Thursday 5 October for our Open Evening, where many of our students are supporting the evening, celebrating the school's offer to those students who are transitioning to us in September. Additionally, Friday 6 October is a non-pupil day, and the school will be closed.
