## **Teaching and Learning Update**

As a school, we are ambitious for every child in our care. Every lesson supports our drive to enable pupils to know and understand more. Staff and pupils have worked really hard since September to engage with the exciting phase of our Teaching and Learning development under new leadership. We believe that student engagement in learning is created through dynamic and active lessons, creating a thirst for knowledge in all students.

A change implemented in all lessons, are the fact they start with 'Do Now's'. These are short, recall exercises that strategically plan spaced knowledge retrieval of previous content and allow students to self-regulate their learning. Recent student surveys and monitoring visits have commented on their effectiveness across all subjects.

Teachers have also been working hard on the importance of questioning. Staff have been using a variety of techniques such as:

- Cold calling
- Show me boards.
- Say it better.



These have been explicitly chosen to create a culture of questioning in all lessons to stretch and challenge our pupils. The school has made a huge investment in 'Show me boards', or mini-white boards, in every classroom so that staff and pupils can rapidly check for understanding and give explicit feedback in the classroom. This also allows staff the opportunity to skillfully check for any misconceptions or gaps in knowledge.


