## Target

The target grade for the end of Yr11 is a long-range target based upon the results of Key Stage 2 attainment, a national measure produced by the Department for Education.

## PPG (Professional Predicted Grade)

The PPG grade is a grade that your child's teacher has predicted they will achieve at the end of Yr11 if they continue to progress as they currently are.
