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#### **Key Stage 3 Assessment & Reporting Update – Information for Parents**

As many may know, we are currently updating our Key Stage 3 Assessment & Reporting procedures to parents. As we speak, we have changed our reporting procedure to reporting to parents 3 times a year, as well as having these reports on Go4Schools, which you can view as a parent live.

The following report dates for parents below indicate when we, as a school will send home a school report. The school report will include the assessments that have been completed in that term. For point of reference, assessments 1 & 2 are completed in the autumn term, assessments 3 & 4 are completed in the spring term and assessments 5 & 6 are completed in the summer term:

- 8<sup>th</sup> December 2023
- 29<sup>th</sup> March 2024
- 12<sup>th</sup> July 2024

We understand that parents/guardians want to know how their children are doing, and as such, we want to report progress on a regular basis. We also understand, due to the nature of timetabling and some subjects having more teaching time than others, that some subjects will assess more often than others. 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#### **Dora Love Prize Induction**

Last Monday we took eleven year 10 students to 'The Hold' in Ipswich to take part in the Dora Love Prize Induction. This is a prize run by the University of Essex in memory of Holocaust survivor, Dora Love. Here they took part in a variety of workshops with other schools. These workshops included looking at primary documents, public speaking and using art to express ideas. The students then travelled to The University of Suffolk to listen to a talk by Holocaust survivor Maurice Blik. Here they heard about his experiences as a child survivor of the Holocaust and were given the opportunity to ask questions. This was an amazing opportunity for the students, who asked some very interesting and well thought out questions.

The students represented the school fantastically and this was commented on throughout the day from multiple members of the organisation and teachers from other schools. The students did themselves proud and I really look forward to seeing how their project develops over the coming months.

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
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## **Teaching and Learning**

This year we have introduced a whole school approach to the start of each lesson called 'Do Now'. Inspired by the work of Doug Lemov, 'Do Nows' are short activities that focus students on starting work as soon as they enter the classroom, without waiting for a teacher direction to start class.

An effective "Do Now" benefits both student and teacher. It allows students to transition from previous lesson(s) and what was learned to what is being presented today and create connections. It encourages student focus, self control and responsibility, and an environment where students learn as a class.

Student surveys caried out reflect a really positive response to the new routines. For example, one pupil commented that 'it allows me a chance to recall what I was taught in the previous lessons'. Many pupils commented on the consistency of the start of lessons, enjoying the opportunity to retrieve knowledge over time. This was supported by a recent trust visit from the CEO Craig Morrison. His student panel highlighted that 'Do Now tasks in silence are a big improvement' to lessons.













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# **School Uniform and Equipment**

We value the support of our parents and carers in ensuring our students are dressed and prepared correctly for each school day.

We welcome the support of our parents and carers with making sure students meet our high expectations and are proud of their association with Stowmarket High School by wearing the correct uniform. We have had issues with small numbers of students wearing facial piercings, leggings and hoodies, and we politely remind you to ensure your child does not have any of these items ahead of coming into school each day. It is also important that our students wear their blazer and tie every day. Our uniform expectations are on our website:

With regards to equipment, it is imperative our students have the equipment needed to learn effectively in the classroom and these include:

- Pens (black or blue), 1 Purple pen, 2 x pencils; ruler; rubber; pencil sharpener; protractor; compass; scientific calculator; a bottle of water as a minimum expectation.
- Appropriate kit for PE lessons
- Ingredients for Food Technology lessons
- An appropriate bag (one which is big enough to carry all the necessary equipment and kit)

In addition, students benefit from bringing other basic stationery including colouring pencils, rubbers and specialised equipment for particular lessons.

To support our expectations, tutors undertake regular uniform and equipment checks. As part of this, any banned items (such as facial piercings and hooped earrings) are confiscated and securely stored at Student Services until the end of term. Where any student presents an issue they cannot resolve in that moment, tutors issue a uniform pass in the first instance (e.g. no tie/blazer, wearing leggings or white trainers) and will make contact with you. However, if the student's uniform infringements persist, tutors and the leadership team alike will issue a C4 after-school detention as a minimum and consideration will be given to a student being placed in our Reflection Room until the situation is resolved.

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# **Parliament Trip**

Our students leaders and members of the student union took an exciting trip to London last week. We arrived in Liverpool street and for some of our young people this was their first time in the London Underground. We all enjoyed a wonderful walk along the South bank along the River Thames. Seeing some great sights such as the London Eye and the Houses of Parliament. We ate our lunch in Westminster square watching people protest, learning from the emotion and power that comes from expressing freedom of speech outside London's most powerful palace.

In the afternoon we were taken on a tour of the Houses of Parliament, learning all about the history of the building, formally a church and then a palace for Kings. The students were amazed to learn that the main hall where Queen Elizabeth and many others were laid in state, was once Henry VIII's indoor tennis court. They were taken to the public gallery of the House of Commons to watch a debate followed by a trip to the strangers gallery to observe a debate about the power of the Arts in The House of Lords. Some of us even bumped into Baroness Tanni Grey Thompson on the way out. We ended our day with a workshop in the education centre, where students were able to learn about the suffragettes and all the ways they could lobby parliament to make a change.

The students' knowledge of the way our democratic system works was amazing and they represented our school with pride.

This week are setting up our mock polling station with the help of the student leads we hope the whole school will feel empowered to cast their vote and make a difference.




































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#### Year 7 & 8






























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# **Design Clubs**
