U13 Girls Handball- Regional Finals



On Wednesday, the Year 8 girls' handball team travelled to the Regional Schools Handball Finals at the Herts and Essex Sports Centre, representing Suffolk against top teams from across the region.

In the group stage, they faced strong competition from Thorpe St Andrew, Alameda, and hosts Herts and Essex. The opening match against Thorpe started off nervously, but the team found their rhythm, securing a hard-fought draw thanks to two goals from Keri Nauvunivuni.

Building on that momentum, the girls delivered a confident performance in their second game against Alameda. With a quick start and composed play, they cruised to a 3-1 victory—Keri once again finding the back of the net for all three goals.

Their final group game pitted them against the tournament favourites, Herts and Essex, with Stowmarket stepping in as underdogs.
