Happy End of Term Families!

This term has seen many exciting opportunities arise for your children both inside and outside of school. This term we have had trips galore, namely, The Duke of Edinburgh, Disneyland, Twickenham rugby tour, Imperial War Museum and the Wicked west end show, to one that is almost upon us which is the sports Malaga visit.

Students, parents and the local community have embraced the school performance 'We will rock you' with 4 sell out shows. The performances were truly incredible, and it was lovely to see so many performers and the mix of year groups involved from Year 7 to Year 11.

We are very excited to hear about the School Expansion progress and are now in the final stages to agree to the construction site set up. This gives us an understanding of any disruption the school may encounter, and we can plan to adjust accordingly. The athletics track is also set to be completed in the summer term, which means the school will be able to benefit from access during the school day in the near future. Whilst we accept these works will come at a significant cost to the school in the short term, the long-term gain of improved sports facilities, together with a new building to cater for the growing number of students wanting to join us will far outweigh this.

Drop day has just taken place and again was a rave success, a special thank you to Mrs Utteridge and Mrs Mylrea and all the other teachers that set up and lead an event or visit. There was a vast range of events that supported students' personal development and time was devoted in the school day to important topics that are not as prevalent in the usual core curriculum. Events included workshops such as 'food bite back', Maths, Careers, as well as external performances and guest speakers to name a few...

Year 11 interventions are well underway with students benefiting from bespoke and targeted morning booster sessions and selected students being invited to Easter workshops. It now is the last stretch for











our Year 11's and we hope that they are all going to make the most of every lesson and intervention upon them to give the best chance of success when they open their envelopes in August.

I am also incredibly pleased and proud to say that for another year running the school is oversubscribed and that we have a high number of students on the waiting list, who are desperate to join us in September.

#### Attendance

The Department for Education recently issued reports on attendance and they showed just how closely attendance and attainment are linked.

At secondary school, the research shows Year 11 pupils with near-perfect attendance are almost twice as likely to achieve grade 5 in English and Maths GCSE, compared to similar pupils attending 90-95% of the time, and 3 times more likely than persistently absent pupils who only attend 85-90% of the time. In other words, missing just 10 extra days a year reduces the likelihood of achieving these grades by around 50%.

Missing school doesn't just affect exam results and a child's time in education – it can impact future earnings too. Persistently absent pupils in secondary school (those with less than 90% attendance) could earn  $\pm 10,000$  less at age 28 compared to pupils with near-perfect attendance. For each additional day of absence between Years 7 to 11, the typical pupil could miss out on an average of  $\pm 750$  in future lifetime earnings.

We are proud of our attendance figures at Stowmarket High School, with our overall attendance standing at nearly 0.5% higher than the national average for secondary schools. But we know must continue to make improvements to achieve the best outcomes for our students.

With that in mind, we will continue to:

- contact families via comms and phone on any day they do not report their child's absence from school
- undertake home visits to families where any child has three or more consecutive days of absence
- write to families where their child has declining absence and/or is persistently absent (this may mean we refuse to authorise a child's absence without medical evidence);
- refer families to the Education Welfare Service where their child's absence contains unauthorised absences and the child is persistently absent



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 consider issuing a family with a Fixed Penalty Notice, where a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) for unauthorised reasons, including where a family has taken a planned absence such as a holiday

We appreciate your ongoing support with your child(ren)'s attendance as we seek to ensure they achieve the best possible GCSE results when they reach Year 11.


#### **Disneyland Paris Visit**

Year 7: Adding value to the science curriculum through a specialist day on forensics




