Celebrating Success: Ofsted Praises Stowmarket High School's Ambitious Curriculum

This ensures that students are not only challenged academically but also supported to thrive and grow as individuals. The personal development was also a highlight with Ofsted recognising the "comprehensive arrangements to support pupils" personal development. Tutor time, assemblies, lessons and dedicated days allow character development, wellbeing, culture and planning for the future to be explored thoroughly. For example, pupils learn to look after their physical and mental health, have positive relationships, contribute to the community, and keep themselves safe online. Pupils benefit greatly from this programme. The school's strong careers

programme is inclusive of all pupils' needs".

Bromcom

Hopefully, you have already been receiving our correspondence about our change in Management Information Service to Bromcom. As part of the Kingfisher Trust, all schools in the trust have been moved to Bromcom. As already mentioned, the aim is to have all school information in one area, making it easier for parents and carers to gather information on their child/children. Please be aware we will still be using our email, text and website as key communication tools to keep you in touch.

Furthermore, in the last week we have seen Bromcom report attendance and behaviour (positive and negative) for your child, as well as giving you updates on timetables etc. As we move into the next academic year you will also be able to track your child's attainment and effort performance as well as update your account, such as payments for dinner money, school and trips. And updating medical information.

Please also keep any eye out for activation emails regarding the Bromcom app. Many parents and carers have already activated their accounts. Please do check your junk folders for the email from Bromcom. As always, if you have any difficulties please do contact the school and we are more than happy to assist. We are also launching a Bromcom Student App from September, meaning students will be able to follow their own performance and journey through school, accessing key information.

Finally, a general comment on our wonderful school. It was a real pleasure last week witnessing all our students coming together to celebrate Sports Day. Such events are difficult to plan but give a different insight and perspective into a student. The behaviour and conduct of our students were exemplary and a real compliment to the successes we have had this year. Such success is also only manageable through the continued support of parents and carers, including the discussions and observations from yourselves that make us as a school reflect and improve our practise.

Behaviour and Safeguarding

It is hard to believe that a full academic year has passed since I joined Stowmarket High School as Deputy Headteacher in September 2024. It has been a rewarding and inspiring year and I continue to be impressed by the character, attitude, and potential of our students.

Young people today face a wide range of challenges, many of which were not present a generation ago. Despite this, the students at Stowmarket High have shown remarkable resilience, kindness, and a strong moral compass modelling our R.I.S.E values (Respect, Integrity, Success and Empathy) in abundance. I have seen them make positive choices, support one another, present themselves with pride, and approach their learning with commitment. The recognition the SEN team and teachers received in the Ofsted report was a real boost after months of hard work and I am so proud to say I work with all these amazing people and even more amazing students.

In true Mrs Broxton fashion, I have not been resting, there is still more work to do, and we have big goals to achieve in the new academic year. A flavour of what is to come:

- Mrs Langley will be our new Assistant SENDCo (specialising in Communication and Interaction)- deputising for me when needed and supporting the team with a new level of leadership
- Mrs Gerard is now a Lead SEND professional specialising in screening and interventions
- We have appointed a new SEND Lead Professional specialising in Social, Emotional and Mental Health
- We have appointed a new SEND admin assistant as Mrs Jackson jets off to Australia to live with her family. Mrs Griss will start in September
- We will be introducing new SEND surgeries where parents can come in and talk about their child if they have concerns or there are additional needs to consider
- Twice yearly review cycles of their One Page Profile
- Parents will be given access to provision map to see the profiles easily

There are more plans that I'd love parents' opinions on - so we will also be offering an opportunity for parents to join our co-production team in September. This is a half termly one hour meeting where we discuss specific items. A chance for you to have your voice on proposed changes or strategies in SEN at Stowmarket High School, as a parent. We will follow up with more information in the new year - our first topic will be 'Dyslexic friendly schools'.



I want to thank all the SEN parents and pupils for welcoming me into this role and really look forward to working with you in the coming academic year.






Modern Foreign Languages
