What Is Student Voice?

Student Voice gives pupils a platform to share their ideas, concerns, and feedback. It helps build confidence, leadership, and communication skills, while also improving the school environment and supporting emotional wellbeing.

How It Works

We've introduced several ways for students to get involved:

- Friday Morning Forums: Led by senior staff, covering topics like teaching, behaviour, and safeguarding.
- Book Studies: Staff review student work and discuss progress openly.
- Student Council: A dedicated group of Year 11 students lead initiatives and fundraising for chosen charities.
- SEND QA: One-on-one conversations with SEND students to ensure their needs are met.
- Access to Leaders: Students can speak directly with Curriculum Leaders and Heads of Year.
- MVA Leadership: New this year, supporting vulnerable learners including those with SEND or eligible for Pupil Premium.

- Builds leadership and confidence
- Creates a more inclusive and respectful school culture
- Helps tailor learning to student needs
- Promotes fairness and equity


Robotics at Stowmarket High School

A group of students have now started attending the Robotics club on a Wednesday and Friday lunchtime to learn more about programming and the



Non Uniform Days

Application Process – Checklist Before Applying (WSC/ASFC/OSFC)

The application system has changed – students will now need to upload certain documents during the application process, if applicable to them.

New

- All applicants will need a recent passport style photo (digital)
 - In colour
 - Pale background
 - Full face looking directly at the camera, including head and shoulders and centred within the frame
 - No filters or editing
 - No other people, pets or objects in the photo

If applicable:

- Current support information:
 - · Digital copy of EHCP

If available:

- Digital copy of Access Arrangements (Form 8/9)
- Digital copy of an Emergency Care Plan
- Digital copy of IHCP
- Details of PEEP
- If applicants haven't lived within the UK for the last 3 years a digital photo
 of their passport or Settlement Share Code.

Reminder of other info needed

- Personal email address (applicants should select "I don't have access to my school email" to avoid having to include school email address too)
- Full home address
- Mobile number
- Parent/Guardian details (minimum of 1)
 - Their full name
 - Personal email address
 - Home address (if different to applicant)
 - 2 contact numbers (Mobile/Work/Home)
- Predicted grades/school report
