Year 9 Girls Football

highlight reel. Minutes later, Ellie nearly repeated the feat, but the Ixworth keeper pulled off an excellent save to deny her.

With the score locked at 1–1, the match went to penalties. Lylah White stepped up to go in goal and made a couple of crucial saves to keep Ixworth out. From the spot, both Lylah and Dulcie Cardy showed composure to bury their penalties, while Ixworth missed four of theirs.

Stowmarket 3–2 County Upper

The Year 10 Boys produced a dramatic late turnaround to book their place in the next round of the County Cup, edging County Upper 3–2 in a thrilling encounter.

Much like last week's performance against Mildenhall, Stowmarket dominated possession throughout the first half, moving the ball with confidence and controlling the tempo. However, they spurned numerous chances to trouble the County Upper goalkeeper.

Against the run of play, County Upper took the lead shortly before half-time. A long throw into the box caused confusion among the Stowmarket defenders, and the visitors headed the ball home, giving them a 1–0 lead at the break.

Stowmarket responded superbly in the second half, increasing their intensity and finally finding the quality their play deserved. The breakthrough came midway through the half in spectacular fashion—Leyton producing a stunning overhead kick that flew into the net and ignited the team.

The momentum swing didn't last long, though, as County Upper regained the lead with a well-struck effort from the edge of the box that nestled into the bottom corner. Stowmarket, however, showed great resilience. Just minutes later, Lewis brought the sides level again, finishing calmly after the ball fell to him on the edge of the box.

With the game heading towards a nervy finale, Stowmarket pushed for the winner—and it came in the dying moments. A handball in the area gave them a golden opportunity from the spot, and Leyton stepped up with confidence to bury the penalty and seal a 3–2 victory.

The win sends Stowmarket into the next round, where they will face King Edwards as their County Cup journey continues. A battling performance, a dramatic finish, and a result fully deserved.
